CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION

This chapter contains the last part of the research, which is conclusion and suggestion. The conclusion is discussed about the result of the research, while the suggestion discusses about suggestion that provide by the writer for the future research who intent to do research in similar study.

5.1 Conclusion

The writer concludes that code switching is a common thing to use, specifically in this podcast, Boy William with Ovi Dian in the episode "*Anak Ovi Dian Sakit Parah! Ovi Dian Perlu Bantuan*". The results of this research support those of other studies showing that the speakers in the podcast, Boy William and Ovi Dian, used various forms of code switching. The mostly used type of code switching found are intra sentential, as it occurred in conversation between both speakers within the sentence. And for inter sentential, as the second mostly used proven that both speakers have great fluency in both languages; Bahasa Indonesia and English. However, the writer can't find any of tag switching in the conversation made by Boy William and Ovi Dian in this podcast.

In this research, the writer also found there are also function of people use code switching.

The examination of code-switching functions revealed a diverse range of communicative purposes. One frequently function observed was clarification, where speakers employed code-switching to resolve ambiguities and enhance understanding. This suggests that speakers may switch between languages strategically to provide additional context or clarification, contributing to the overall comprehensibility of the conversation.

A further use of code-switching was for emphasis, enabling speakers to draw attention to particular ideas or points in their speech. Speakers can improve the expressive quality of their speech by effectively emphasizing specific concepts or emotions through the use of language switch. Furthermore, code-switching created intimacy and connection between speakers by enabling personalization. This feature improved the interpersonal dynamics of the podcast conversation by allowing speakers to establish a sense of familiarity and connection.

Another noteworthy use of code-switching was interjection, which was used to draw the audience in and lightly express emotion. Speakers could express deeper by completing their speech with interjections that convey sentiments of surprise, enthusiasm, or even emphasis.

However, some code-switching functions—like topic change, objectification, reiteration, and untranslatability can not be found in the podcast data. This implies that although code-switching has a variety of communicative purposes, its application may

differ based on situational elements like conversational objectives, audience composition, and speaker preferences.

By this research also, the writer found that globalization take an impact to both speakers in this podcast, as they are used to have more conversation in bilingual in their daily routine as entertainer. It is also based on more youtube channel, podcast, or other social media easily to access, hence, the viewer getting used to listen other languange than Bahasa Indonesia.

5.2 Suggestion

The writer has some suggestion based on the discussion, findings, and also conclusions from the study of code switching in this research. Those suggestion are as follow.

First, as we are live in era globalization and also digitalization, it is important to have knowledge in English. Especially through this research, the writer considers more people are used to switch language in daily conversation, profesionally or even in private life.

Second, it has been found that the speakers used code switching in some functions to deliver message so no missed interpretation by interlocutor, emphasize the conversation, and also to clarify the purpose of utterance.

Third, for those who want to have research for their final thesis defense in English department, may uses this research as their reference. With this research, the writer hopes it will have good reference for any future research with the same study and subject.
