


CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

5.1 Conclusion

In conclusion, the researcher found that the main character of the film Moon Knight suffers from a mental illness known as dissociative identity disorder. The researcher reveals that 17 data are showing a correlation between characterizations and dissociative identity disorder in the main character (Marc Spector). Childhood trauma and Iatrogenesis are the two factors that contribute to the main character mental disorder. Childhood trauma (sexual or physical abuse) is the primary cause of dissociative identity disorder of the main character. There are four kinds of secondary symptoms of dissociative identity disorder, namely, auditory hallucination (4 data), localized amnesia (5 data), derealization (1 datum), and depersonalization (8 data). Based on the factors of dissociative identity disorder, the primary symptom of mental disorder, and the secondary symptoms of dissociative identity disorder, it is concluded that the type of mental disorder suffered by the main character is dissociative identity disorder through childhood trauma because of the main character mother mistreatment (verbal and physical abuse) of him during his childhood.
