CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter consist of the conclusion and suggestion. The conclusion is based on the analysis of the research problem while the suggestion is proposed to give information to future researcher to conduct the further research about this topic.

5.1 Conclusion

Conclusions are drawn to highlight the answers to the research questions. To analyze the tense error, I adjust it according to the formula for each tense and it is supported by the Herring's theory, and for the type of error using the Dulay's theory. This study uses a qualitative descriptive technique.

By finding error analysis in the text distributed through questionnaires to students of English Department Universitas Nasional, there are 280 data consisting of tenses errors and translation errors. There are 80 data samples in the error tenses where the past continuous is the tenses as the most errors with 25 data (31.25%), while the type of error that occurs the most is misformation, which is 29 (72,5%) data.

5.2 Suggestion

For further research to use more diverse types of tenses, because the more diverse types of tenses are used, the more errors are found, in translating a word one must be careful and careful so that the intended meaning is conveyed properly.
