CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

This chapter provides a conclusion based on the summary of the data analysis in the previous chapter. The suggestion is also presented for the next researchers who do similar research.

5.1 Conclusion

The study was conducted to find out the types of word formation in the English Translation of the Holy Qur'an by Mishary Rashed Alafasy. The material which has been analyzed in this study was Surah Al-Mulk. In conducting the research, this study used a descriptive qualitative research method. Besides, this study used the theory proposed by George Yule (2010). Based on the theory, there are 10 types of word formation processes, which are Coinage, Borrowing, Compounding, Blending, Clipping, Back Formation, Conversion, Acronyms, Derivation, and Multiple Processes.

The analysis of the data is concerned with the research question which is "What are types of Word Formation are found in the English Translation of Holy Qur'an's *Surah Al-Mulk* by Mishary Rashed Alafasy?". After analyzing the data, this study found only two types of all 10 types of word formation processes in *Surah Al-Mulk* which are Clipping and Derivation. Based on the Data Analysis, there were 51 data on word formation found in the *Surah Al-Mulk*, Clipping 2 data, and

Derivation 49 data. The derivation is the most common process that is found in *Surah Al-Mulk*. There were 49 data of derivation processes for all 51 of the data.

From the Data Analysis of this research, it can be seen that eight types of word formation processes were not found in Surah Al-Mulk, which are Coinage, Borrowing, Compounding, Blending, Back Formation, Conversion, Acronyms, and Multiple Processes. Probably, the language style of the Qur'an is the most formal.

5.2 Suggestion

Some suggestions that are recommended to English Learners, the English Literature study program, and the next researchers who have the same field of study. First, for English Language Learners. Learning word formation is very useful to broaden knowledge of more dept English Language, especially in Linguistics and Grammar. By knowing the types of word formation, it will be easier for students to form a new word. Second, for the English Literature study program, this research suggests that can be beneficial for lecturers as additional material in teaching Linguistics. Especially on Morphology. Third, for the next researchers who have the same field of study. This study suggests studying a lot about Linguistics, especially the word formation process in morphology where new words are formed by using some processes such as Coinage, Borrowing, Compounding, Blending, Clipping, Back Formation, Conversion, Acronyms, Derivation, and Multiple Processes. In addition, this Research can be a reference for other researchers for

related studies. Hopefully, this can be useful to increase the knowledge of the reader about the types of word formation.
